Commuter Services Adds New Tracking Feature to Annual Earth Day Challenge

York, Pa. (April 18, 2018) – For the ninth consecutive year Pennsylvania commuters will have the opportunity to earn rewards for reducing air pollution through Commuter Services of Pennsylvania’s annual Earth Day Challenge. In addition to earning reward points redeemable at local and national businesses, this year, commuters can use the newly-launched Commute PA program to track their participation in the challenge.

Every year, Commuter Services of Pennsylvania’s Earth Day Challenge encourages local commuters to give up driving alone and try a greener way of getting to work. Commuters can choose from any number of green forms of transport, including public transit, carpooling, vanpooling, biking, walking or even telecommuting.

Because Earth Day falls on Sunday, April 22 this year, Commuter Services is asking all commuters taking up the challenge to track their travels in the new Commute PA program on Friday, April 20.

In Commuter Service’s newly released Commute PA program, commuters can receive points from the trips they track and redeem those points for rewards at local and national restaurants, retailers and entertainment venues. Points can also be used to enter monthly raffles offering higher value rewards and exciting prizes.

One randomly-selected grand prize winner will receive a Kindle Fire for logging an Earth Day trip.

Commuters who want to participate in the challenge have until Monday, May 7 to log their commuting details through the Commute PA program. More details about the challenge are available at pacommuterservices.org/earthday2018.
