

The Susquehanna Regional Transportation Partnership (SRTP) has been laser focused on their mission of improving air quality, decreasing regional roadway congestion and improving the physical and financial health of commuters for more than a decade. The Transportation Demand Management (TDM) program, Commuter Services of PA, was developed and implemented by the SRTP in a direct effort to carry out this mission.

Our program offers "boots on the ground" assistance to employees and employees by taking educational information about transportation options directly to the front doors of hundreds of businesses on a yearly basis. Our professional TDM outreach staff offers guidance on the utilization of our Commute PA platform, Emergency Ride Home program, Best Workplaces for Commuters recognition and many other TDM tools which help to promote various non-drive alone commuting options.
